#### **EOTC Permission Forms**

Rosebank School has implemented a new policy whereby we would like your informed consent to allow your child to attend any school trips in the Auckland Area. You will still be notified of any school trips coming up and if we require your support with supervision. The school will still follow all relevant risk assessment procedures as per our EOTC policy. The form detailing this more can be picked up from your classroom teacher, so please pop in and see your child's classroom teacher to sign this off as soon as possible if you have not done so already.If you have any questions or concerns please contact your classroom teacher. Aligning with our policies, this year children that are 10 years or older may bring a bike or scooter to school - with written permission from a parent/guardian. Bikes and scooters will need to be road safe and helmets are required. We also suggest providing a lock to ensure these are safe while at school

### **Free lunches in School**

In 2021 we will be trialling a Ministry initiative of 'Free Lunches in School' it is called 'Ka Ora Ka ako' which roughly translates to Good health leads to excellent learning. This will run from Monday to Friday where each child will receive a prepared lunch that will cater to their dietary needs. Parents are no longer required to provide lunch for their child. This will begin in week three of this term.
