Rosebank School (1471) Enrolment Scheme

Effective from Term 2, 2023

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under Schedule 20 section 4 of the Education and Training Act 2020 (formerly section 11G (3) of the Education Act 1989) for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below and/or shown on the attached map shall be entitled to enrol at the school (see below)

Starting at the Whau River Bridge where Rata Street becomes Ash Street, travel northeast along Ash Street until it becomes Great North Road, then continue until Heron Park (up to 1621 Great North Road, northwest of boundary included). Travel in a straight line across Heron Park the coastline, then turn west along the coastline around the Rosebank Peninsula back to the zone's origin point.

All residential addresses on included sides of boundary roads and all no exit roads off included sides of boundary roads are included in the zone unless otherwise stated.

Proof of residence within the home zone will be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Special Programmes

The school runs the following Special Programmes approved by the Secretary.

- Te Whānau ō Pātiki - Māori Bilingual Pathway
- Tupulaga Mo A Taeao - Samoan Bilingual Pathway

Special Programme – Criteria for Entry for both programmes

- Whānau commitment to the programme
- Whānau commitment to attending language programme classes and meetings

Process for Enrolment

Students will apply for a place on the programme and will be accepted based on the enrolment criteria described above. If there are more applications than places students will be selected by running a ballot using the following priority groups:

- Siblings of students currently on the programme
- Siblings of students who have previously attended the programme
- Students who have attended a previous bilingual unit
- All other applicants

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the

school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

First Priority will be given to students who have been accepted for enrolment in the following special programme(s) run by the school and approved by the Secretary for Education.

- Te Whānau ō Pātiki - Māori Bilingual Pathway
- Tupulaga Mo A Taeao - Samoan Bilingual Pathway

Second Priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.

Third Priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.

Fourth Priority will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.

Fifth Priority will be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.

Sixth Priority will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth, or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group must be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued the Secretary under Schedule 20 section 4 of the Education and Training Act 2020 (formerly section 11G (3) of the Education Act 1989). Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.
